How to Pray the Rosary

On each of the larger beads announce the mystery and reflect upon it while saying the Our Father.

On each one of the set of ten smaller beads, called a decade, recite the Hail Mary.

After the tenth small bead say the Glory Be... followed by - O my Jesus, forgive us our sins and save us from the fires of Hell; lead all souls to Heaven, especially those in most need of thy mercy.

After the final fifth Mystery say:

Hail, Holy Queen, Mother of Mercy! Our life, our sweetness, and our hope! To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve; to thee do we send up our sighs, mourning, and weeping in the valley of tears. Turn, then, most gracious Advocate, thine eyes of mercy toward us; and after this our exile show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus; O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

Pray for us, O holy Mother of God. That we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ.

O God, whose only begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life, grant, we beseech Thee, that meditating upon these mysteries of the most Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we may imitate what they contain, and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ our Lord.

Amen.

The Sequence of the Rosary

(Starting at the Cross)

Make the Sign of the Cross

Say the Apostles' Creed

On the first bead say the Our Father

On each of the next three smaller beads say a Hail, Mary

On the next bead say the Glory Be

Start the Mystery by announcing which of the Mysteries you are meditating on

Say the Our Father

Recite 10 Hail, Marys

Say the Glory Be and O my Jesus

Then announce the next Mystery

Continue on thru each decade reciting each Mystery and the prayers

After the last Mystery, say the Closing Prayer - Hail, Holy Queen...

End in Amen and Make the Sign of the Cross



The Rosary Prayer

The Rosary is a prayer that proclaims the Gospel. With the addition of The Redemptive Mysteries, the five mysteries are a declaration and an affirmation of the Christian Faith.

It is while reflecting on The Blessed Virgin Mary through this prayer we can strengthen our devotion. The Rosary guides us through the series of specialized prayers that focuses on the ministry of Jesus and shows the path to Salvation.

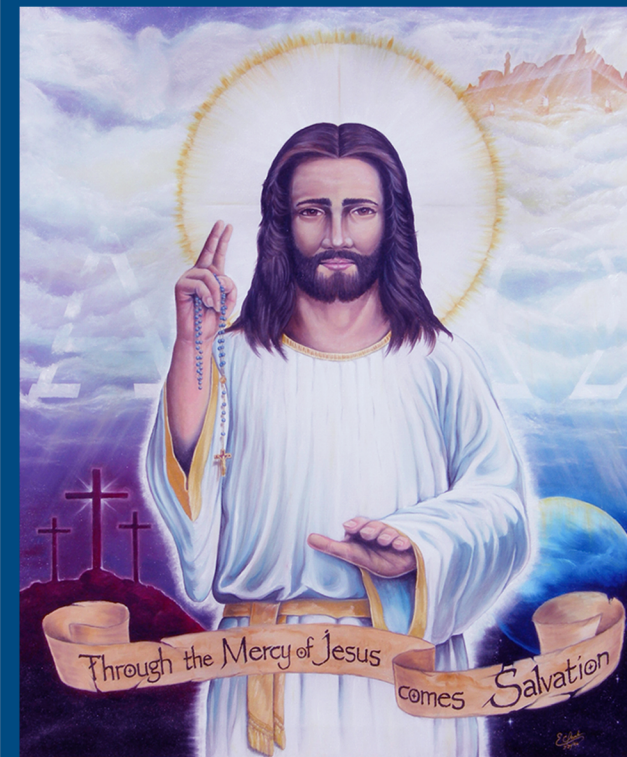

Symbols in the Iconic Painting of Salvation

The Original is a Life-size painting of Jesus by Artist, E. Clark.

The Painting brings you before Our Lord as you have passed from this world and you kneel before Him to receive your judgment. Jesus blesses you and welcomes you into God's Kingdom.

1st Symbol – The Rosary Raised in Jesus' Right Hand
(The First Painting of Jesus holding a Rosary.)

The Rosary is raised for you to receive the blessing from Our Lord.

2nd Symbol – Jesus places His left hand on your bowed head
Jesus blesses you as you kneel before Him once you have received your Judgment. It is here we all pray to hear Our Lord say to us, "Well done, good and faithful servant; enter now into the Master's Kingdom."

3rd Symbol – The Rosary

This Rosary illustrates the link to Our Lady and the previous four Rosaries and now the 5th Redemptive Mysteries Rosary.

4th Symbol – The Face of Jesus

Artist rendition of Jesus' Face.

5th Symbol – The Halo

The Halo encircling His head is also the Holy Eucharist.

6th Symbol – The Glow Around Him

The painting is dark at the bottom and becomes lighter at the top. But, Jesus is not to touch the Darkness.

On the Left side

7th Symbol – The 'A' Alpha

The Beginning, the Genesis.

8th Symbol – The Cross at Calvary

It is ONLY through the CROSS and Our Lord Jesus Christ that we are raised and able to enter into the New Jerusalem.

9th Symbol – The Holy Spirit

Symbolized by a Dove, the image of the Holy Spirit formed itself as the sky and clouds were painted; and only highlighted detail was added.

On the Right side

10th Symbol – The 'Ω' Omega

The End, the Revelation.

11th Symbol – The World in Darkness

As revealed in St. Faustina's Diary, she was given a vision of the world in Darkness lit by the Golden Glow from Heaven. As Mankind falls from the Grace of God, our world becomes Even Darker.

12th Symbol – The New Jerusalem

To illustrate Heaven as described in the book of Revelations is Impossible. The attempt here was to show a place aglow in the Light of Our Lord and with many Gates and many Levels and Palaces.

Faith

Proclaiming the Holy Trinity

We know that we live in him and he in us, because he has given us of his Spirit. And we have seen and testify that the Father has sent his Son to be the Savior of the world. If anyone acknowledges that Jesus is the Son of God, God lives in him and he in God. And so we know and rely on the love God has for us. God is love. Whoever lives in love lives in God, and God in him. In this way, love is made complete among us so that we will have confidence on the day of judgment. . . (1 John 4:13-17)

Reconciliation

Cleansing of Mind, Body and Soul

Once you were alienated from God and were enemies in your minds because of your evil behavior. But now he has reconciled you by Christ's physical body through death to present you holy in his sight, without blemish and free from accusation- (Col 1:21-22) "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more." (Heb 8:12)

Death

Dying to this Life

"I tell you the truth, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life and will not be condemned; he has crossed over from death to life. I tell you the truth, a time is coming and has now come when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God and those who hear will live. For as the Father has life in himself, so he has granted the Son to have life in himself. And he has given him authority to judge because he is the Son of Man. (John 5:24-27)

Judgment

Standing before Jesus

He said to me: "It is done. I am the Alpha and the Omega, the Beginning and the End. To him who is thirsty I will give to drink without cost from the spring of the water of life. He who overcomes will inherit all this, and I will be his God and he will be my son. (Rev 21:6-7) For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive what is due him for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad. (2 Cor 5:10)

Salvation

Rising to Eternal Life

I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Now the dwelling of God is with men, and he will live with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away." (Rev 21:2-4)

The Redemptive Mysteries

Why the Fifth Mystery of the Holy Rosary?

Originally written in 2005, the author proposes the Fifth Rosary as the final rosary and is to Tell the World of God's Great Mercy for the Salvation of Mankind.

The Fifth Rosary completes the Rosary circle with five mysteries and includes Us in God's great plan for our Salvation. From the beginning and throughout its pages, the BIBLE proclaims the message - that as a sign of God's Love for us and our Love for Him, He will take us from this Life to be one with Him for all ETERNITY. This is the Greatest Mystery of all – SALVATION.

1st Mystery – Faith

This First Mystery professes our belief in the One true God. We are baptized in the name of the Holy Trinity and proclaim our trust in Jesus Christ and acknowledge Him as Lord and Savior.

2nd Mystery – Reconciliation

This Mystery recognizes our sinfulness and that it is only through the Mystery of God's Forgiveness can we be cleansed. Once we acknowledge our weakness and confess them before God we can be open to receive the Blessings of God's Grace.

3rd Mystery – Death

The Third Mystery shows that, although we must die to this world, we will be granted Eternal Life through Jesus Christ. Death is a mystery. But, if we believe in the Truth – the Truth will set us Free.

4th Mystery – Judgment

The Forgiving Grace of God's Love is a Mystery. When we leave this world we will stand before God to receive His Judgment. We will face our past faults and sins and be judged justly and we must atone for all we have done – both good and bad. We leave our humanity behind and look upon the face of God; and before all the Heavens receive our Judgment.

5th Mystery – Salvation

Salvation is the Greatest Mystery of all. It is the great conclusion proclaimed in the BIBLE. The last proclamation of the Nicene Creed states - *We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.* It is why God gave us His Son and left us the Holy Spirit. It will be here – The New Jerusalem – that we will spend all Eternity with our God.
